

Career Experience Course

- ► The purpose of the Career Experience
 - enable students with disabilities to further develop:
 - career knowledge and skills necessary to identify their career options
 - access community resources and practice employmentrelated behaviors.
- The course will provide guided practice and experiences in school and community employment situations



Career Placement Course

Career Placement Course is provided for students who maintain paid employment while enrolled in the Transition Education Program.






